



Tatmadaw leadership and other security forces are alarming and requires actions to hold those accountable of these crimes.

My delegation is appalled by the nature of the systematic and oppressive conduct against the Rohingya people in Myanmar. Their plight shames us all, as one humanity. International human rights law and international humanitarian law has been violated to the core of its noble principles. Human dignity and human decency had been ripped and robbed. The Maldives once again reiterates its call upon the Government of Myanmar to cease all atrocities and hostilities committed against Rohingya people and to allow the safe return of the thousands who have fled the violence.

The Maldives supports the recommendations identified by the International Independent Fact-Finding Mission on Myanmar. We support the call for an independent, impartial mechanism to collect, consolidate, preserve and analyze the evidence of human rights violations., including the recommendation for targeted individual sanctions against the perpetrators. Further, my delegation echoes the call for the establishment of a trust fund for victim support to facilitate psychosocial support, legal aid and livelihood support.
